BC LAW ENFORCEMENT MEMORIAL	To facilitate coordination, funding and increased attendance at the annual BC Law Enforcement Memorial event held in September.

DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION	<p>To provide timely and informative educational sessions to the members of BCACP on the topic of Diversity and Inclusion.</p> <p>The BCACP Diversity Committee will have an "internal" focus and will provide police leaders in BC with information to help them promote diversity and inclusion within their police service and communities. Focus will be on understanding what diversity and inclusion means to the communities we serve and what it looks like to those communities. To do this, the Committee will identify emerging (and in some cases existing) trends, identify a SME, and invite them to address the membership at the BCACP at least once annually.</p>
DRUGS	To promote safer and healthier communities in British Columbia through proactive leadership by identifying drug enforcement strategies and initiatives. To actively engage stakeholders and through consultation promote the treatment of substance abuse and prevention strategies.
FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS	To report on significant issues affecting the membership that have or are occurring within the membership objectives.

<p>LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN</p>	<p>To increase awareness and support of Special Olympics fundraising initiatives that help Special Olympics athletes experience acceptance, achievement and admiration through sport.</p>
<p>LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE</p>	<p>To organize and deliver a notable and effective police leadership conference in BC To provide current and topical presentations to mid-level law enforcement leaders to strengthen their development.</p>
<p>LIQUOR CONTROL & LICENSING</p>	<p>Liaise with Government regarding liquor compliance and enforcement issues</p>
<p>MENTAL HEALTH & ADDICTIONS</p>	<p>Engage community partners, working towards improving health outcomes for people living with substance use and mental health issues.</p>
<p>ORGANIZED CRIME</p>	<p>To ensure BC Chiefs and OIC's are well informed as to the Organized Crime landscape in British Columbia while promoting collaboration and innovative gang reduction strategies with the objective of enabling evidence-based decisions that will increase public safety in each of their respective communities.</p>
<p>PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS / ETHICS & INTEGRITY</p>	<p>To evaluate ethical issues relating to the BCACP and ensure ethics is at the foundation of everything the BCACP does and participates in. Explore and promote ethical practices, training & awareness throughout BC's law enforcement community. Be a conduit between CACP and BCACP Ethics Committees.</p>
<p>SEXUAL ASSAULT AND INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE</p>	<p>To work with justice and public safety sector partners to promote policy and practice improvements that enhance public safety and offender management and accountability in the areas of Sexual Assault and Intimate Partner Violence.</p>

POLICING WITH INDIGENOUS PEOPLE	To work collaboratively to share best practices regarding Indigenous policing issues and trends to enhance relationships with our Indigenous communities.
TRAFFIC SAFETY	To promote public safety by identifying, prioritizing and addressing common road safety issues of the police community and their partners, and TO promote legislative reform in support of increased road safety.

MANDATE	
CANADIAN ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE (CACP)	To represent the BC Association of Chiefs of Police at the Canadian Association Board of Directors.
CROWN POLICE LIAISON	To promote effective communication between Police and Crown at a senior level; to address systemic issues affecting police and Crown at a provincial policy level
NATIONAL POLICE SERVICE	The Advisory Board is composed of representatives from each provincial Chiefs' association and members of the RCMP National Police Service. The Advisory Board meets twice a year and receives updates on the status of programs. Input from the Advisory Board members is also sought, including any concerns from the provinces about the delivery of National Police Services.
PPOLICE TRAINING STEERING COMMITTEE (PTSC)	To provide a forum for RCMP and municipal police department executives to discuss and promote harmonized police training in BC and to leverage opportunities that may exist by sharing and collaborating on high quality police training initiatives.
REGIONAL OPERATIONS POLICE MANAGERS (ROPMC)	Meets monthly and is attended by all LMD Municipal PD and RCMP Operations Officers as well as CFSEU, INSET, RTIC, Cn Rail, LMD Traffic Services, LMD District, LMD ERT and other local support services as available. The meetings are rotational with the emphasis for each committee member hosting a meeting. These meetings provide opportunities for value-based discussions and engagement on current issues, emerging trends, best practices, project updates and general networking.

SPECIAL PURPOSE COMMITTEES	MANDATE
MEMBER RESILIENCY	To provide tools and training for police agencies in BC to help members be healthy, with an emphasis on mental and emotional health
MISSING WOMENS INQUIRY	To provide strategic advice on, and a forum to facilitate coordinated actions on police-related <i>Missing Women Commission of Inquiry</i> (MWCI) recommendations.
POLICE EMERGENCY ALERTS	In collaboration with EMBC, develop a process to issue Police Emergency Alerts on behalf of all BC Police agencies.
POLICE RESPONSE TO HOMELESSNESS	To share and create policies, guides and best practices in the spirit of enhancing overall service delivery on a reasonably consistent basis to this issue. To develop key relationships/partnerships with applicable agencies across the service spectrum. To advocate to levels of Government as appropriate.
